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Foreword

This edition of the *Statistical Business Profile for Russia's Chelyabinsk Region* is one of 25 yearbooks in the BIA series encompassing Russia and CIS, the Russian Federal Districts and industrially-developed Russian regions. This series, published annually since 2000, is a compilation of up-to-date detailed statistical information pertaining to the markets of both Russia and CIS.

Included in this edition are four main sections (Economic, Social, Demographic and Company), 38 principal subject areas, and an array of marketing topics ranging from socioeconomic trends and background information to key consumer market indicators. Indicators are presented in table format, and numerous extrapolated tables are included. For easy comparison, data for all regions included in the business profile series are displayed in a standardized format. All information has been comprehensively reviewed and updated. Note that this information is also accessible, via the Internet, as part of BIA's statistical online database.

Each statistical table presents comparative information in the form of either chronological trend lines from 1990 to 2005 or single-year data for the latest year available. Using data extending back as far as 1990 enables the reader to analyze information to discern long-term socioeconomic trends. Likewise, including charts for each table illustrates indicators as dynamic trend elements. This approach highlights positive/negative economic, social, and demographic trends at the regional, administrative district and/or national level(s).

Guide to Using the Business Profile

1. Scope of the Business Profile

The *Statistical Business Profile for Russia's Chelyabinsk Region* is a statistical yearbook of business and marketing information featuring more than 450 pages of the latest detailed marketing statistics in 38 principal subject areas. Data contained in this edition reside in a statistical database of marketing information for Russia and CIS that is regularly updated by BIA's research team.

The *Statistical Business Profile for Russia's Chelyabinsk Region* is your single, one-stop source for essential statistical information regarding a myriad of economic topics ranging from population to education to health care, and much, much more. Quickly identify trends at the macro or micro level using information that's presented thoroughly, yet concisely.

Information contained in this edition derives from a wide range of sources including reports, studies and research from BIA's own research team over the past 15 years (much based on original extrapolations). This edition is a "must have" for anyone looking for hard-to-find information about one of the fastest-growing, attractive markets in the world.

Business profile sections encompass a wide variety of marketing topics, ranging from socioeconomic trends and background information to key consumer market indicators. Socioeconomic data include indicators for national, district, and regional levels.

In the 2006 business profile series, each statistical table presents comparative information in either chronological trend line from 1990 to 2005 or single-year data for the latest year that information is available. All indicators are presented in both table and chart formats.

Where data appear in value form, units generally have been left in national currencies and calculated. However, data contained in spreadsheets can be converted to U.S. dollars. For easy comparison between the national, district, and regional levels, calculations have been made, where appropriate, to show growth rates over the defined period and per-capita data.

Using the *Statistical Business Profile for Russia's Chelyabinsk Region* is easy. Simply look up the tables for the topic of interest using the contents or index. Easy-to-interpret tables and charts contain the relevant data for each level. The heading shows the relevant section, title summary, table and chart titles and unit. Sources used to compile the data appear below the table and any relevant notes are listed at the end of each section.

2. Subject Coverage

The *Statistical Business Profile for Russia's Chelyabinsk Region* has four main sections – Economic, Social, Demographic, and Company. Within these sections is detailed marketing information that has been compiled by PlanetInform and is described as follows.

Economic Section

1. Marketing Geography

Learn about the geographical and socioeconomic factors that comprise the Chelyabinsk Region. The region's geography and climate are described, as well as the primary socioeconomic indicators by economic sector for the last year including:

- agriculture, mining, and construction industries
- industrial resources and output by main industries
- communication and transportation services
- finance
- retail and wholesale trade
- investment and foreign trade activity

Also included are social indicators such as income, wages and pensions, food consumption and consumer prices, housing, health, education and cultural activities, population, labor, and employment at the national, federal district, and regional levels.

2. Companies and Corporations

Contained in this chapter are statistical compilations that illustrate trends for companies and corporations in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and the Russian Federation. Much of the data included are from 1990 to 2005, forming a basis for market forecasts and projections.

3. Small Businesses

This chapter includes trends in the number of businesses with foreign capital investment; private, state, and municipal unitary businesses; production output of small businesses; and the total number of small businesses in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1998 to 2005.

4. Economic Indicators

Trends associated with total GDP, consumption and expenditures per capita, and national wealth at the national, federal district and regional levels are presented, based on data from 1995 to 2005.

5. National Wealth

Explore trends in the value of industrial fixed assets and depreciation rates of fixed assets as a percentage of total fixed assets in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation. Fifteen years of data (from 1999 to 2005) is presented.

6. Agriculture Indicators

What are the farming trends for the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation? Based on data from 1991 to 2005, this chapter describes agricultural output by crop (potatoes, vegetables, fruits and berries, and land use), farm product (dairy products, meat and poultry, eggs, and wool), and livestock (cattle, sheep and goats, and hogs and pigs) in both table and chart format.

7. Plant Growing

This chapter discusses trends in the region regarding growing fruits and berries, grains, land use, potatoes, sugar and beans, sunflower seeds, and vegetables. Trends are represented as both tables and charts based on data from 1990 - 2005.

8. Farm Products

Production of dairy products, eggs, meat and poultry, and wool in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation is outlined in this chapter. Trends representing data from 1990 to 2005 are represented as both tables and charts.

9. Number of Livestock

This chapter includes trends in raising cattle, hogs and pigs, and sheep and goats in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1990 to 2005.

10. Mining and Energy

This chapter examines oil and gas extraction and the mining of coal in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation. Data presented ranges from 1990 to 2005.

11. Construction Industry

Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation construction trends are outlined in this chapter. Construction information from 1990 to 2005 data regarding new building for out-patient facilities, hospitals, preschools, homes and other new construction projects is described.

12. Regional Industrial Resources and Output

This chapter includes trends in industrial output, primary energy production, and production profit rates in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1992 to 2005. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

13. Food Production

Trends in food production for such products as butter, meat, bread, baked goods, and dairy products in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation are discussed. Trends representing data from 1990 - 2005 are represented graphically in both table and chart format.

14. Beverages

What trends can be identified regarding beverage production in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation? This chapter outlines trends in production of alcoholic beverages including wine, and brandy (cognac) based on data from 1990 to 2005. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

15. Clothing, Textiles, and Footwear

Learn about production of footwear, fabric, knitwear, and hosiery in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation. Track trends using data from 1990 to 2005.

16. Chemical Production

This chapter explores trends in the production of mineral fertilizers; synthetic resins and plastics; and tires in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1990 to 2005. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

17. Lumber and Wood

Production trends in paper, commercial wood, plywood, sawed wood, and pulp in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1990 to 2005 are presented.

18. Building Materials Output

This chapter includes production trends, in table and chart format, for cardboard, prefabricated reinforced concrete, building bricks, and cement in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation based on data from 1990 to 2005.

19. Metallurgical Production

Production trends in steel, ferrous rolls, and steel pipes for the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation are presented. Data are presented in table and chart format for period from 1990 to 2005.

20. Machine Manufacturing

This chapter includes trends in production of metal-cutting machines and tractors in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1990 to 2005. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

21. Communication Service

This chapter includes trends in communication service revenue per capita and ground-line telephone users per 1,000 people for both urban and rural populations in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1992 to 2005. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

22. Transportation

Trends in public transportation (including public bus and rail) and freight transportation (railroad freight and trucking freight) in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1990 to 2005 are represented in both table and chart format.

23. Finance

Consolidated budget revenue and consolidated budget expenses by subject from 1992 to 2005 in the Chelyabinsk Region, and Russian Federation are discussed. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

24. Retail Trade

Restaurant sales, per-capita retail sales, and total retail sales from 1995 to 2005 in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation are explored in this chapter.

25. Service

Trends in the growing service industry are explored in this chapter. Information presented includes the volume of service per capita, total volume of service, personal service per capita, and total personal service in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1993 to 2005.

26. Investment

This chapter includes trends in fixed capital investment, per-capita fixed capital investment, and total investment in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1995 to 2005. Trends are represented as both tables and charts.

27. Foreign Trade

A variety of trade-related information is presented in this chapter including trends in imports from countries outside the CIS, imports with CIS countries, exports to countries outside the CIS, and exports to other CIS countries from the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation. An expansive collection of data, presented in easy-to-read charts and tables, ranges from 1998 to 2005.

Social Section

28. Income, Wages and Pensions for the Population

Trends in per-capita income, standard wage, pensions, and number of private cars per 1,000 people in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation from 1991 to 2005 are explored in this chapter.

29. Food Consumption

Track food consumption trends for the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation. Charts and tables in this chapter illustrate the consumption of such food staples as potatoes, milk and dairy products, meat and meat products, vegetables, sunflower seed oil, sugar, bread and baked goods, and eggs based on data from 1990 to 2005.

30. Consumer Prices and Cost Indicators

This chapter includes trends in consumer, food, non-food, and service prices as a percentage of the previous year's spending from 1992 to 2005 within the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation.

31. Housing and Household Facilities

Trends from 1990 to 2005 in per-capita housing in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation are presented in chart and table formats.

32. Health Care

How do citizens of the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation fare in the area of health care? This chapter explores health care trends from 1992 to 2005 in detail and includes trends in morbidity per 1,000 people; quantities of physicians and nurses per 10,000 people; and the total number of hospital beds/number of hospital beds per 10,000 people.

33. Education

Educational trends for the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation, are explored in this chapter. Information encompassing 1995 to 2005 is presented in easy-to-use tables and charts and includes the number of institutions of higher learning and secondary schools; students enrolled in university per 10,000 people, as well as the students attending secondary schools.

34. Cultural Activities

Cultural resources in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District are described in detail in this chapter. Using data from 1990 to 2005, the number of public library books; newspaper circulation data; and quantity of theatre patrons/ museum visitors per 1,000 people are presented.

This chapter describes trends in crimes committed per 100,000 people, the number of homicides and attempted homicides, and the quantity of crimes committed by juveniles in the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District from 1990 to 2005. Trends are displayed in clearly-labeled tables and charts.

Based on data from 1990 to 2005, this chapter contains a comprehensive variety of population statistics for the Chelyabinsk Region, Urals Federal District, and Russian Federation including:

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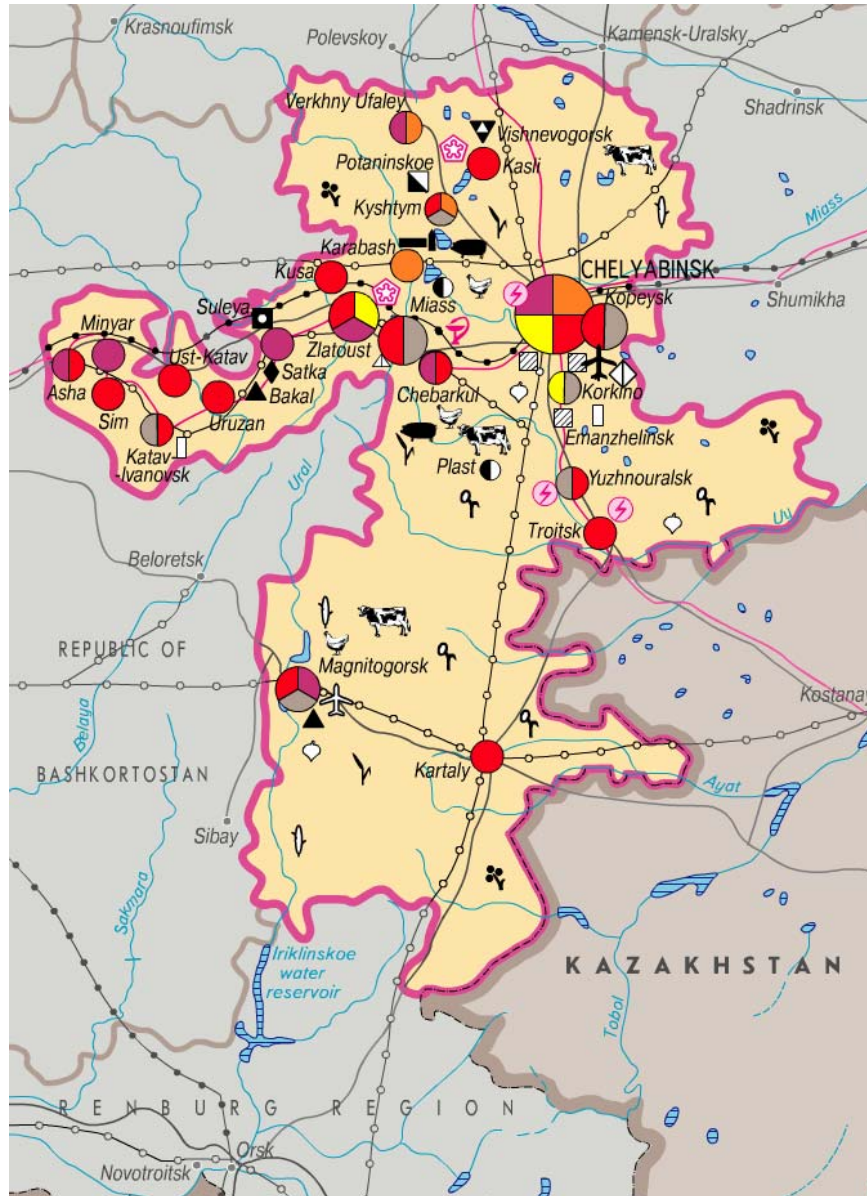

Main Natural Resources: Reserves and Extraction In 2005

The main natural resources of the Chelyabinsk Region are minerals, water, and forest.

Mineral resources

The Region is rich in many different mineral resources including ferrous and non-ferrous metal ores (titanium and magnesium, copper, and nickel ores), coal, chemical feedstock, construction materials, gems, gold, silver, bauxites, and magnesite. Over 300 commercial deposits have been explored, 24 of them contain iron ore (with total reserves of 837 million tons), nine of them contain copper-zinc ore. Two porphyry copper ore deposits and one copper-magnesite ore deposit with combined total reserves of 800 million tons have been discovered. The Chelyabinsk Region's mining companies produce 100% of Russia's kaolin and graphite output, over 95% of magnesite, 70% of talc, 25% of zinc, 15% of copper, 15% of iron, and 37% of facing stone output.

Water

The Chelyabinsk Region is located at the triple watershed of the Volga, Ural, and Tobol Rivers. Their average annual runoff volume within the Region totals 6.84 cubic kilometers. The Region has 467 ponds and water reservoirs with a total storage volume of 5.044 cubic kilometers and usable storage of 3.48 cubic kilometers.

Forestry

2,646,100 hectares of the Region's territory lies under forest, with 731,000 hectares of coniferous forest and 1,612,700 hectares of deciduous forest. The Region's mature and overmature timber reserves total 53.6 million cubic meters, including 23.8 million cubic meters suitable for commercial harvesting. The Region's average annual timber yield is 7.4 million cubic meters.

Geography

The Chelyabinsk Region covers a total area of 87,900 square kilometers. To the north the Region borders the Sverdlovsk Region, to the east – the Kurgan Region, to the south-east – Kazakhstan, to the south – the Orenburg Region, and to the west – the Republic of Bashkortostan.

Climate

The Chelyabinsk Region lies in the temperate continental climate zone. Air temperatures in January average -17°C , rising to $+17.8^{\circ}\text{C}$ in July. Annual precipitation is 350–600 mm.

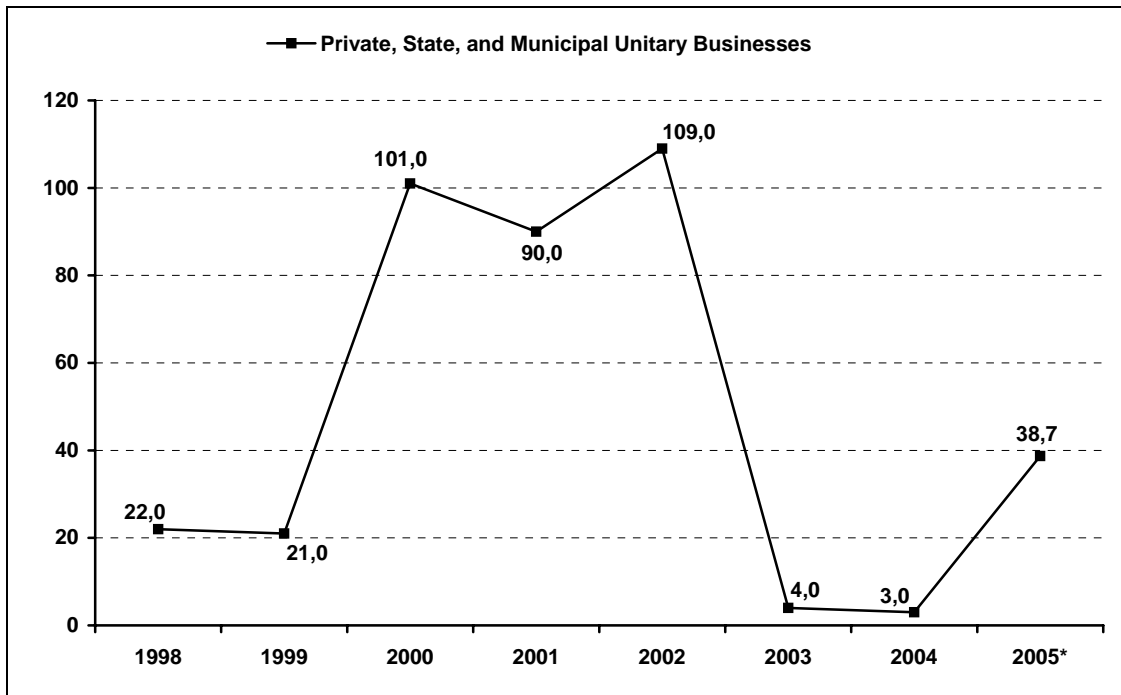

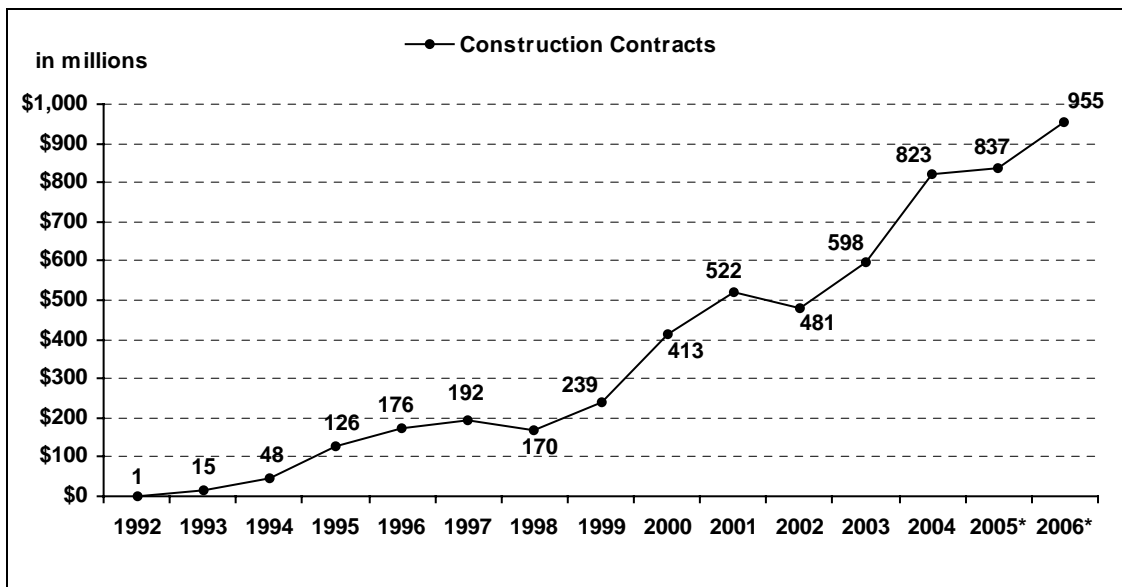

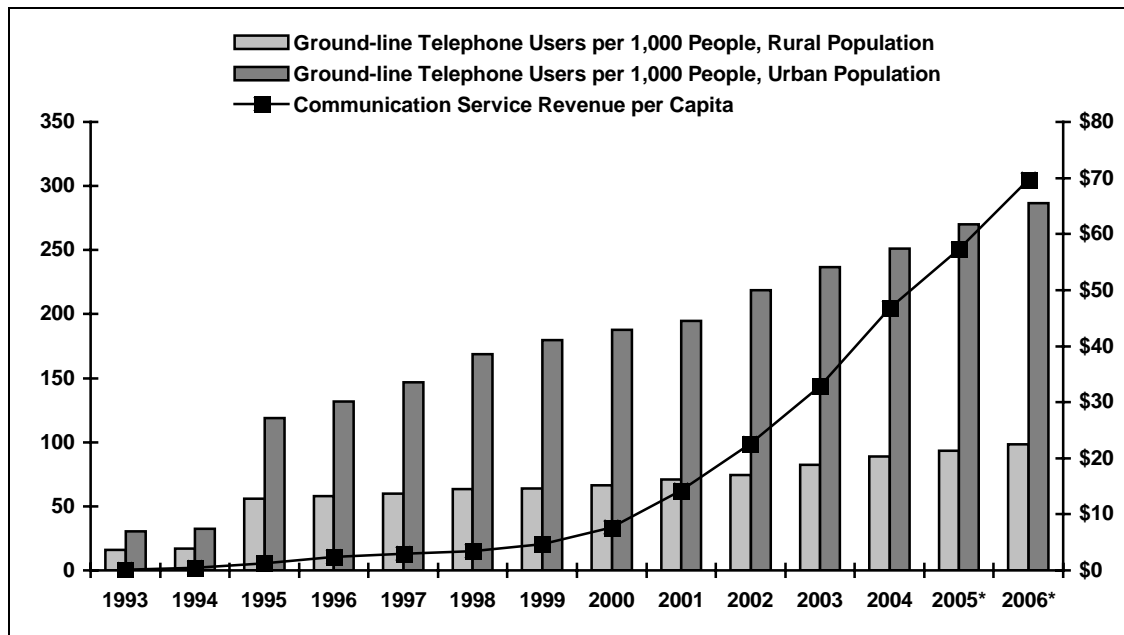
